And 12 so in the interest of time, I won't rehash 13 that information. 14 15 But the proposed requests for proposal are in the binder and hope that 16 everyone got a chance to review those. 17 I'd like to entertain any questions at this 18 time. 19 20 If we can get Jerry 21 SENATOR RUFF: to give us a synopsis of what energy --22. 23

And -- and thank

you, Senator Ruff.

was adopted last -- last -- the energy fund was adopted last May is my understanding, and allocated \$12M.

\$6M of that is earmarked for Southwest and the other \$6M is allocated for the southern -- the southside -- the Southern region.

With that, there's already been an energy focus that we're -- that we're attempting to highlight, whether it be supply chain, ED infrastructure, renewable.

I -- I actually, in some of my briefings heard waste to energy is being considered in -- in many of these different areas. So with that, we would like to see what is out there by actually highlighting what opportunities exist in these regions.

And so the -- the outline that we drafted highlights opportunities, not only with tobacco but with other partners that we can actually seek additional funding with the focus being on energy, energy supply and manufacturing of energy components. Anything having to relate to what's currently happening in the existing

marketplace. So I met with, not only ADP, I 1 met with Dominion and some of the co-ops as 2 to what their opportunities are as also as a 3 way of partnering with these -- with these 4 5 groups. So that's a synopsis of what 6 7 you have in front of you. It's the energy I didn't want to make it restrictive, 8 9 but I also didn't want to open it up to 10 where you have so many you have to look. So we're trying to find a 11 balance and we'll see how that -- how that 12 13 works in -- in this first round. We are adopting, also, the -- the loan part of the 14 15 program as part of this -- which you've 16 heard from Joe Shearin earlier today. 17 SENATOR RUFF: Any questions of 18 either Vicki or Jerry on that -- on that 19 program? 20 21 DELEGATE MOREFIELD: Mr. Chairman. 22 23 SENATOR RUFF: Yes. 24

DELEGATE MOREFIELD: I move to 1 approve the new energy and agribusiness 2 framework. 3 4 MR. BLEVINS: Second. 5 6 SENATOR RUFF: Properly moved and 7 Any further conversation? Hearing 8 All in favor, say aye. none. 9 10 COMMITTEE MEMBERS: Aye. 11 12 13 SENATOR RUFF: All opposed? Okay. On to agriculture. Did you want to add 14 anything to that? 15 16 MS. HUMPHREYS: Yes. The 17 18 agribusiness fund, as you've seen over the 19 last couple of days here, we've had some pretty complex agribusiness projects come 20 in. 2.1 And our new approach to this 22 is simply much more collaborative. 23 going to take pre-applications for the 24

staff review those for a level of -- of 1 complexity that we need to engage other 2 partners to collaborate with us on funding 3 those initiatives. That's all I have to 4 add. 5 6 7 SENATOR RUFF: Any questions of Vicki? 8 9 10 MS. KNIGHT: Excuse me. May I interrupt one second? Someone left their 11 lights on on their car. It's a BMW. The 12 license plate number is GY18X5. So if you 13 left your lights on in your car, you need to 14 go check it out. Thank you. 15 16 SENATOR RUFF: Is there a motion? 17 18 DELEGATE MOREFIELD: All right, 19 20 Mr. Chairman, in my last motion, I did include this report, agribusiness. So we 21 voted previous. 22 23 SENATOR RUFF: All right. I'll 24 take your word for it, Will. We'll move on. 25

That is -- Stephanie, you're up.

MS. KIM: I think we discussed this at the last meeting. But basically, we wanted your approval for recommendation of the Full Commission for approval of administrative fees for our former loan forgiveness program.

If you recall, Southwest
Virginia Higher Education currently
administers that program. It is winding
down, even though those loan payments
continue for 10 years.

So they handle the billing and the funds, as well as -- currently, they still have some active grants where they have to verify employment and residency over the coming years.

So it is for administration fees, \$121,143.00 for this current fiscal year. And this year, we would take it out of an existing incentive -- work incentive grant that we have. But that also is winding down this year. So going forward, it will be part of our administrative

1 budget.

3 | SENATOR RUFF: Stephanie, we have

some new members here that was not here when we were doing the -- the student loan subsidy. Can you kind of give us a high level of what we were -- what we were doing?

MS. KIM: Yes.

SENATOR RUFF: Thank you.

MS. KIM: Previously, really since the inception of the Commission, we had a loan forgiveness program where we would give out student loans to those going to four-year institutions.

And if they graduated and came back to the region to live and work, we would forgive a year of loans for each year that they worked.

So it was good and varied.

But as with many loans that don't have any

underwriting or credit approval, there --

into debt set-off as -- referred to the Office of the Attorney General. So there are about 343 accounts with the Office of the Attorney General for collections.

And then if you don't come back to the region and work and live, then you are in repayment. And they are repaying the Southwest Virginia Higher Education Settlement each month.

They -- they send out bills and then they pay them. And then they pass that on to us each quarter, I think. So -- and then, they're still verifying, you know, graduation and employment and residency for another 500 accounts.

Actually, there are 690 that are either in deferment or still active students. But it is an old program. We haven't done it since 2018, I believe. But it goes on.

SENATOR RUFF: Thank you. Any questions about this expenditure?

DELEGATE MOREFIELD: Mr. Chairman.

SENATOR RUFF: Yes. 1 2 DELEGATE MOREFIELD: I move to 3 approve the administrative costs for fiscal 4 year '24 and for the scholarship work 5 incentive. 6 7 SENATOR RUFF: Is there a second? 8 9 10 DELEGATE KILGORE: Second. 11 SENATOR RUFF: Properly moved and 12 second. Any further conversation? Hearing 13 none. All in favor, say aye. 14 15 16 COMMITTEE MEMBERS: Aye. 17 SENATOR RUFF: All opposed? 18 19 that is approved. Stephen, I think you're up next with the Senior Administrative 20 21 Specialist. 22 MR. VERSEN: About five years ago, 23 I was working at the Virginia Department of 24 Agriculture. And one of my colleagues, 25

Joyce Knight, retired from that organization. I was sad, but I enjoyed working with Joyce but was thrilled to have the opportunity to work with her again, as she took on a job in retirement of helping to organize these meetings for the Commission.

Now after about five years of this work, she is actually going to finally retire this spring, creating a big need by the Commission to do all the work.

There's a tremendous amount of work that goes on before the meeting goes on. We saw this opportunity -- not only to fill this important, but to take on a couple of other needs the Commission has.

We used to have a woman, Stacy Bridges, that did work for us. She helped provide some staff support in the TROF program. We used to have a data analyst who did our data management for us.

Those duties have been distributed amongst the staff and are being done. But we believe that those duties would pull together into a new position and

effectively allowing us to expand what the staff can do. So we are proposing the creation of a new senior administrative specialist position that would service this commission, that would provide support to TROF as well as this new loan program.

I think TROF is run currently by Jordan Butler, who would be supporting him in our work. As well as supporting the new loan program and, importantly, to help with our data management and the current data system we use. The position is — the description is included in your books.

SENATOR RUFF: You've heard the proposal.

MR. BLEVINS: Mr. Chair, I just have a question. If we're seeing this as a budget that we pay all -- all administrative -- you know, just the administration and the -- I'm just trying to make sure we keep that.

MS. KIM: We'll absorb it in the

current year. Because by the time this 1 person is on, it'll only be a few months 2 left. 3 4 MR. BLEVINS: Okay. 5 6 MS. KIM: So we're not asking for a 7 budget amendment at this point. But it will 8 be in next year's budget as a full time 9 10 position. 11 MR. BLEVINS: That didn't answer 12 the question. 13 14 DELEGATE KILGORE: What's our 15 16 percentage -- our percentage of the budget we use to -- to run this -- to run the 17 place, in other words. 18 19 MS. KIM: It's -- it's our 20 21 administrative budget, which should be about 22 \$2M -- just over \$2M a year. So it depends on how much we decide to award in grants as 23 to what percentage that would be of the 24

total budget.

DELEGATE KILGORE: It's less than 1 two percent, right? Less than two percent, 2 right? I think so. 3 4 5 MS. KIM: Yes. 6 7 SENATOR RUFF: It's in the back of the Board book on page 99. 8 9 10 DELEGATE KILGORE: Page 99? And I -- I didn't mean to put you on the spot. 11 just --12 13 Actually, this year we 14 MS. KIM: have a \$2.9M administrative budget. 15 16 total budget, with expenditures of \$28.6M. 17 So it's probably right on that -- just over 10%. 18 19 20 DELEGATE KILGORE: Okay. 21 22 MS. COX: Mr. Chairman. 23 SENATOR RUFF: Yes. 24

MS. COX: Yes, thank you. Thank 1 And Joyce, thank you for your service 2 if you're still here. We're going to miss 3 you. Well done. 4 So -- so what will happen --5 will happen to Joyce's position? We're not 6 going to just fill that position, we're 7 going to create --8 9 MS. KIM: She's currently a part 10 time --11 12 MS. COX: Oh, part time. 13 Okay. 14 MS. KIM: Yeah. So we would fill 15 it with it a --16 17 MS. COX: Okay, perfect. 18 19 20 MS. KIM: -- full time salaried 21 person that would also take on some other duties. 22 23

MS. COX: And what's the breakdown

Usually, a part time MS. KIM: 1 employee works 30 hours or less per week and 2 3 4 5 MS. COX: Oh, I'm sorry. Across the Commission, how many are part time --6 7 MS. KIM: We only have one part 8 time employee and that's Joyce. And that 9 10 was previously a full time position when it 11 was held by Stacy. Except that she -- she went on 12 disability. She -- when she was no longer 13 with the Commission, we had to quickly fill 14 that position just to continue the meetings. 15 So Joyce was already retired 16 from the State. So that -- it would impede 17 with her retirement if she went on full time 18 19 20 MS. COX: Okay, okay. That's fine. 21 22 Thank you, that's fine. My understanding is that Jerry was also a part time person, so 23 you had two part time --24 25

MS. KIM: Well, we have quasi full 1 time staff. So there are several of us that 2 are quasi full time that would work 30 hours 3 4 or more. So all -- they receive all the 5 full time benefits, they're just prorated. 6 MS. COX: So how many quasi -- I 7 mean, I just appreciate knowing. Thank you 8 very much. How many full time, how many 9 10 quasi full time, how many part time? Again, what are the staffing -- what's the current 11 level with the staffing? 12 13 We have four quasi full MS. KIM: 14 15 And then we have one part time. time. 16 then we have nine full time. 17 MS. COX: Okay. Thank you. 18 19 SENATOR RUFF: Any other questions? 20 21 Is there a motion? 22 DELEGATE MOREFIELD: Mr. Chairman, 23 24 I move to approve the creation of the 25 position.

21	foundation.
22	
23	MS. KIM: As you recall from the
24	last Executive Committee meeting, we talked
25	about the creation of a 501-C-3 foundation

to complete the work of the Commission. And 1 the attorney has drafted articles of 2 incorporation, but we do need nine initial 3 4 trustees to be appointed by the Commission to the foundation. 5 One would be an ex officio 6 member from the Tobacco Commission that we 7 -- could currently serve on the foundation. 8 One would be the deputy director that would 9 10 be on the -- the foundation's trustees. And then, we need another 11 12 seven -- or up to seven appointed to the foundation. Or -- and I believe you were 13 going to create a small group to kind of 14 15 work out those details. 16 And once everything is finalized, the Executive Committee has been 17 delegated authority to approve the creation 18 19 of this corporation. 20 21 MR. BLEVINS: Has that small group 22 been working on it then? 23 MS. KIM: No, it has not been 24

created.

So we need the chairman to

designate a few people to --1 2 SENATOR RUFF: So I simply appoint 3 them, is that what you're saying? 4 5 MS. KIM: Right. You need to just 6 7 8 9 SENATOR RUFF: No action from the 10 full Commission. 11 MS. KIM: The full Commission would 12 actually not -- the full Commission's 13 already approved --14 15 16 SENATOR RUFF: Right. 17 MS. KIM: -- the creation. And --18 but they have delegated authority to the 19 Executive Committee to make final approval 20 21 of the documents and the articles of incorporation. But we do need those 22 trustees appointed before the Executive 23 Committee can approve them. 24 25

SENATOR RUFF: So the full

Commission does not have to approve them. So, thank you. Do we have questions?

MR. SHELTON: Mr. Chairman, I just would hope to -- when you make your thoughts, that you could, you know, consider the Southwest in some of those --

SENATOR RUFF: Why? Just making sure.

MS. KIM: So if any of you knows

MS. KIM: So if any of you knows some citizens in those regions that would be interested in serving on the foundation -- we can't have this Board in control of the foundation.

It needs to remain separate.

But former Commission members are eligible.

And really, anyone with an interest in that,
they can work on the Commission.

SENATOR RUFF: Any further questions? All right. Then we will -- I

can then deal with it.

MS. KIM: The citizen members should have received yesterday an email from the Ethics Council. It's to make your financial disclosures by February 1st. It's an online system. So if you have not received it or have any trouble with it, just contact me.

MR. SHELTON: Stephanie, I understand there is a penalty of law if you don't do that.

MS. KIM: Yes. It's actually -the employees are supposed to complete a
statement of economic interest, that there
is a \$250.00 penalty if you don't file on
time.

But for Commission members who signed a financial disclosure form, there is not the financial penalty except, I think, to the Director. And then -- but it still is a condition of serving on the Commission and it's due by February 1st.
